Rationale for program changes

to the Horticulture Major - Professional Option

Student and industry member focus groups, alumni comments, along with faculty assessments of the Horticulture Major were the foundation of the proposed changes.

There is a need to enhance the business training background of the students in the Horticulture Major. To address this need the following changes have been proposed:

- 1. Move AGEC 361 Horticultural Business Management to be an option to AGBI 251 Ag Biochem within the "Other Required Related Courses" area. The majority of Horticulture programs at 4 year institutions around the United States do not require Biochemistry for the undergraduate major. This change is consistent with other Horticulture programs and provides students the opportunity to strengthen their business background. Advisors will strongly encourage students headed to graduate school to take AGBI 251.
- 2. Reduce the number of credits in the "Unrestricted Electives" category in order to require an additional course in a business related field. Students will now be required to take either AFES 310 Human Resource Management OR AGEC 410 Professional Selling.

Other changes in the option are due to individual course changes in titles and/or numbering. Revisions are noted in the yellow highlighted chart below.
