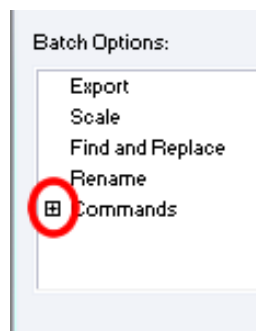
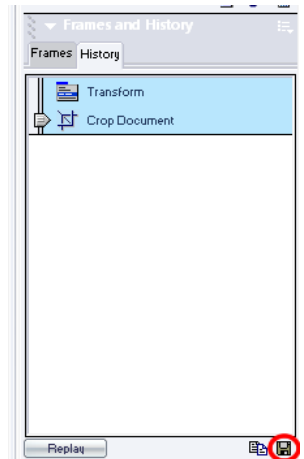


Creating Custom Batch Commands in Fireworks

Although the Batch Commands that come stock with Macromedia Fireworks can be useful, you may wish to apply your own unique changes to several of your pictures at a time. To do this you need to create a custom Batch Command. For this tutorial we'll be creating a command that rotates all of your pictures 90 degrees clockwise.

1. Find a picture, any picture and open it in Fireworks. Note: this can be any picture as we will only be using it to create the Batch Command.
2. Make sure the History Window is open. It should be on the right side of your screen. If it isn't, click **Window>History**.
3. Click once on the picture, then click **Modify>Transform>Rotate 90° CW**
4. Next click **Modify>Canvas>Fit Canvas**
5. Go to the History Window, and highlight both **Transform** and **Crop Document** by shift clicking. At the bottom of the History Window is a small **Save** icon. Click it to save the new command.
6. A Save Command box should pop up. Choose a name that fits your command. In this case call it Rotate 90 CW. Click OK.
7. Now that the command is saved, you can close this picture.



8. Proceed to batch process like you normally would by adding pictures. In the next window, the batch process window, click the cross next to the word **Commands**. Scroll to the bottom. Your new command will be there.
9. Follow the rest of the steps for normal batch processing.
