

WISCONSIN IN SCOTLAND

Faculty Application

The West Central Wisconsin Consortium (WCWC) has established a cooperative campus in Great Britain to provide students with a semester or six-week summer educational experience that not only permits continuation of a basic program of studies, but also includes elective course offerings in British studies. Wisconsin in Scotland (WIS) is a study abroad program offered through a consortium of UW campuses: River Falls, Stout, Superior, Oshkosh, Parkside, Whitewater and the UW Colleges.

These campuses will provide faculty members for each semester and summer offering. Applicants for a semester faculty position must submit a curriculum proposal for five 3-credit courses (including the catalog course description and syllabus) that the applicant could teach for one of the offerings in Great Britain. Applicants for a summer faculty position must submit a curriculum proposal for three 3-credit courses (including the catalog course description and syllabus). **Course offerings that require a prerequisite are discouraged.**

The deadline for submission of applications to the Director of International Education/Programs has been extended to April 1, 2009.

2. Teach, counsel, and advise students while abroad.
3. Use the experiences and materials I have gained abroad to internationalize the courses I teach on my home campus.
4. Reside at Dalkeith House and participate in the cooperative work programs and serve as staff on a revolving duty basis.
5. Actively recruit students for the program by:
 - assisting the Director of International Education/Programs at my home university in recruiting for WIS;
 - recruiting in my classes prior to my Dalkeith appointment;
 - recruiting in my classes following my Dalkeith appointment;
 - inviting prospective students to apply;
 - following up with interested students; and,
 - meeting with student groups to provide information, brochures, forms, etc.
6. Participate in student/faculty orientations.
7. Agree to arrive at Dalkeith House prior to the students' arrival.
8. Participate in all regularly scheduled staff meetings at Dalkeith House.
9. Make my own travel arrangements. You will be reimbursed for actual costs per guidelines in the Faculty Handbook.
10. Meal plan charges will be waived for faculty members. Their dependents and/or their spouse/partner may purchase a meal plan at the dining facility. There are no cooking facilities in the faculty accommodations.
